PREAMBULE (Introduction)

- This regulation refers to the CSIT Championships and Technical Committees' general regulations adopted at the CSIT Congress.
It cannot derogate from them.
- All activities of the CSIT, including championships, are reserved to the members of the CSIT Unions, and to the observers and members of the international Confederations with whom the CSIT has signed cooperation agreements according to rules laid down by the CSIT General Regulation: COPADET (American Continent) / BAWs (Balkan region) and OSTA (Central Africa). Also Non CSIT members and company sports teams can participate in the CSIT Championships.
- CSIT organizes amateur championships and has Fair Play as one of its most important goals and values. CSIT Championships are strictly open to amateur sports. To participate in CSIT Championships the defined eligibility criteria per sport must be respected
- The CSIT Sporting activities (championships, training, tournaments, rallies, etc.) are organized under the responsibility of Technical Committees by discipline.
- The Technical Committees are composed of one representative from each CSIT Union participating in the sport. They elect their own president at the TC meeting by depending on conditions shown in the General Regulations.

1. MAMANET CHAMPIONSHIP

1.1. PERIODICITY /AGE GROUPS

- **Mandatory:** CSIT Mamanet championship for **GROUP A** (mothers at any age and women 30 years and over that are registered in Mamanet's website) will take place every 2 years during the CSIT world sport games.
- **Optional:** CSIT Mamanet championship for **GROUP B** (women 18 years and over) will take place every 2 years during the CSIT world sport games only if possible according to registration and courts availability.

1.2. REGULATIONS

- Championships follow MAMANET regulation
(see: <http://www.mamanet.org.il/International.asp>) technical instructions, regulations and rules of the game.



2. PARTICIPATION CONDITION

2.1. PARTICIPATING UNIONS

- Members of CSIT unions, observer members and members of international confederations that have signed a cooperation agreement with the CSIT, can participate. The organizing Union can invite non-affiliated CSIT federations and company sports teams to participate in CSIT Championships or the CSIT World Sport Games.
- More than one team per union can participate

2.2. MAXIMUM PARTICIPANTS

- Each participant team shall not have more than 15 members
 - 12 players
 - 1 referee
 - 1 Coach
 - 1 Team Manager / Head of the official union delegation

2.3. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Players are allowed to participate in the CSIT MAMANET Championships as long as they don't play in any professional (national or international) Volleyball league.

3. REGISTRATION / FOUNDING

3.1. REGISTRATION DELAY

- Provisional registration: at least four (4) months before the championship starts.
- Final registration: at least two (2) months before the championship starts.
- Final registration must include the list of all delegation members (first name-last name-birth date-gender-function)

3.2. COVERING CHARGES

- Unions pay for all travelling costs to the city where the championship is held (round way).
- The organizing Union shall pay charges of the following-:



- ✚ Transportation of the delegation from the airport or train station to the hotel on the day of arrival and back to the airport on the day of departure,
- ✚ Local transport during the stay depending on the program (Particularly between hotels and sport facilities)
- ✚ Full board accommodation (double room, breakfast, 2 meals a day)
- Every participating Union shall pay a registration fee as determined at the latest CSIT Congress to the organizing Union for each member of the delegation.
- By the time of issuing of the provisional application forms, the organizing Union can collect an advance payment of 50% of the total amount to be paid by the participating Union. The remaining amount shall be paid at the time of the permanent registration or on the day of arrival (final deadline).
- Additional personnel accompanying their respective delegations shall pay a special daily fee, which will be established by the organizing Union.

3.3. CANCELLATION POLICY

- Cancellation policy will be provided in accordance with CSIT official invitation to the World Sport Games.
- Championship cancellation: the organizer will reserve the right of cancellation, if there are less than 4 member unions preliminary registered, in which case the organizer will refund all payment transactions.

4. ACCREDITATION/MEMBERSHIP CARD

- Each player must possess a valid personal Union's membership card.
- The Union's membership card must include the following information: Name, surname, age, photo, association, personal signature.
- -Every player and technical staff member must present an official identity card if requested. Membership and identity cards must be available at the sports hall.

5. ORGANIZATION

5.1. ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

- The organizing committee is in charge of the preparation and management of the championships during its duration. It is composed of Organizer Union representatives and of the CSIT MAMANET Technical Committee chairman (or his accredited proxy) and secretary.



5.2. INVITATIONS

- The organizing committee sends championships invitations to every CSIT Unions (and partners), company sports organizations, guests etc. at least nine (9) months before the start of the championship. Invitations must include this information:
 - Participation;
 - Sporting activities, social and cultural program;
 - Required Officials
 - Boarding facilities;
 - Arrival and departure accommodations;
 - If possible, general program.

5.3. PREPARATION

- Depending on the situation and the CSIT Sports Director's authorization-, a member of the technical committee (chairman or secretary) can visit the location where the championship is organized, at least three (3) months before it starts, to settle the planning and preparation of the championship with the organizing Union. Travelling expenses can be covered under certain conditions by the funds awarded to the MAMANET Technical Committee by the CSIT.

6. REFEREEING

- Qualified referees and official scorers only ,shall be admitted to supervise the matches and to assure that the game rules- are ideally applied in a homogeneous way
- The referees will not fill another position within their own delegation.
- The Organizing Committee shall provide one Referee and one Scorer for every match. The Organizing Committee will also supply a Scorer stand with a Flip Scoreboard, an official Score-sheet (with two transferrable copies) and a Referee stand.
- During the semifinals and finals, the Organizing Committee shall provide one Assistant Referee and four line referees.
- Each Union must provide one Referee per participating team. Unions who do not apply to this rule must pay the organizing Union an amount specified in CSIT regulations to cover substitute referee's fees.



- Referees must be official referees of their own Union on a national or international level. If necessary, a Union can contact referees from MAMANET
- The Technical Commission will determine the refereeing conditions according to the discipline needs based on MAMANET regulation.

7. APPEALS COMMITTEE

7.1. The Appeals Committee is composed of:

- The CSIT Technical Commission's President
- The CSIT Technical Commission's Secretary
- A person among the participating Unions. Such member shall not participate in the appeals in which his own Union is involved.

7.2. An appeal committee is appointed for every championship in agreement with MAMANET rules of the game and regulations.

8. AWARDS

8.1. REGULATION FOR THE AWARD MEDALS:

- Team ranked 1st: Gold Medal / Champion CSIT MAMANET
- Team ranked 2nd: Silver Medal CSIT MAMANET
- Team ranked 3rd: Bronze Medal CSIT MAMANET

8.2. These medals should be at least 60 millimeters in diameter and 2.5 millimeters wide. The CSIT logo must appear on one side of the coin and on the other side, the name, date and venue of the championship.

- The organizing union is in charge of providing the awards including expenses.
- Each team will receive no more than 14 medals (players, Coach, technical manager), plus another medal for the head of delegation.

8.3. Each of the other teams will receive 1 souvenir medal per person (14 medals maximum) plus another one for the head of delegation.

- These medals will have a diameter of at least 50 millimeters. The CSIT logo must appear on one side of the coin and on the other side - the name, date and venue of the championship.

8.4. Each Referee will receive a souvenir medal (same characteristics as those described above - § 8.3)



8.5. The Organizing Union can (if it wishes to) provide rewards or other commemorative souvenirs of the event, in addition to those mentioned in this chapter.

9. TECHNICAL COMMISSION MEETING

- The Technical Commission meets annually during the championship. The meeting is prepared in advance by the president and secretary of the Commission. A summon detailing the date and agenda will be sent to all Unions at least 3 months ahead of schedule.
- A preparation and information meeting is organized before the championships under the responsibility of the chairman (and/or Technical Committee secretary) and head of the organizing committee from the organizing Union. The meeting will inform all delegations of the championship plans, appoint referees to matches and present clarifications to regulations, if necessary, to ensure the event's success.
- The above meeting shall designate the associate Unions who will host the Championships for the next years.
- The president and secretary of the Technical Committee may convene additional meetings during the championship whenever decisions are necessary.
- At the end of the championship, the leader of the organizing Union will provide the Chairman of the Technical Committee all documents related to the championship (team's rosters, scoresheets and other reports...)

10. ORGANIZATION

- All championships shall take place given a minimum of four (4) participating parties.
- The championship will not last more than five (5) consecutive days, plus another two (2) days for travel (day of arrival, day of departure).
- Championships are held in pools followed by (depending on the number of teams involved) quarterfinals or direct semifinals and finals.
- Each team will play at least three (3) matches during the championship.
- No team shall play two (2) consecutive matches without an interval of at least 2 hours between them.
- The championship modus has to be sent to the TC at least 14 days before the event and be approved by the Committee. On the day of the arrival of the TC chairman or secretary the modus has to be approved and modified if proven necessary.



11. FORMULA

11.1. The competition will be held in accordance with the formula decided by the TC.

11.2. MAMANET Cachibol rules are applied within all matches.

11.3. **Rules for championships held in pools:**

- The unions involved will be divided into pools according to their ranking, obtained at the last championship in their class
- If necessary, the distribution of the participating teams for the first time will be determined by a draw.
- **Pool ranking criteria**

In order to establish the ranking of teams, the following criteria shall be implemented

i. **Number of victories**

The teams will be classified in descending order by the number of matches won.

ii. **Ranking Points**

In case of equality in number of matches won, the ranking points will be considered.

iii. **Set ratio**

In the case of equality in the number of matches won by two or several teams, the teams will be classified in descending order by the quotient resulting from dividing the number of all sets won by the number of all sets lost.

iv. **Points ratio**

If the tie persists as per the set ratio, the teams will be classified in descending order by the result of dividing all points scored by the total of points lost during all sets.

v. **Still tied ?**

If the tie continues as per the point ratio between two teams, the priority will be given to the team which won the last match between them. When



the tie in points' ratio is between three or more teams, a new classification of these teams in terms of points 1, 2 and 3 will be created taking into consideration only the matches in which they were opposed to one another.

12. FAIR PLAY

- 12.1. The participants must behave honorably and with courtesy, in the spirit of "fair play", not only to referees but towards other officials, opponents, team-mates and spectators.
- 12.2. Communication between team members during the game is permitted.
- 12.3. A team is vicariously liable for every unsportsmanlike act carried out by these bodies: team players; position holders; team fans; any element connected with the team and/or any other element associated with the team.
- 12.4. It's prohibited to boo or support in an unsportsmanlike fashion. A referee can stop a game and/or give points to a rival team when team fans boo or shout in an offensive way at the referee and/or the rival team. In such a case a ruling of technical loss will be made after consulting with the professional director.
