PREAMBLE (Introduction)

- ✚ This regulation refers to CSIT Championships and Technical Commissions general regulations adopted at the latest CSIT Congress.
It cannot derogate from these regulations.
- ✚ CSIT organises amateur championships and has Fair Play as one of its most important aims. CSIT Championships are open strictly for amateur sportsmen. To participate in CSIT Championships the defined eligibility criteria of each sport must be respected.
- ✚ All activities of the CSIT, including its championships are open to the members of the CSIT Unions, observer members Unions and members of the international Confederations with which CSIT has signed cooperation agreements according to CSIT general regulations: COPADET (American Continent) / BAWS (Balkan region) and ALSO (Central Africa); also non CSIT members, partners, governmental bodies, trade unions and companies can participate in the CSIT Championships.
- ✚ CSIT Championships are organised under the principle of a Zero Tolerance Policy. Not playing for political, religious or discriminatory reasons will lead to the immediate exclusion of the team/athlete.
- ✚ CSIT Championships are under the regulations of WADA. Athletes may be required to take a doping test. More information can be found in the CSIT anti-doping policy which can be downloaded from the CSIT website:

- ✚ CSIT Sporting activities (championships, training, tournaments, rallies, etc.) are organised under the responsibility of Technical Commissions by sport. If a problem not covered by the regulations arises, the TC will apply the Mamanet rules.

- ✚ The Technical Committees are composed of one representative from each CSIT Union participating in the sport. They elect their own president and secretary at the TC meeting in accordance with the General Regulations.

1. MAMANET CHAMPIONSHIPS

1-1 PERIODICITY / AGE GROUPS

- ✚ Mandatory: CSIT Mamanet championship for **GROUP A** (mothers of any age and women 30 years and over who are registered on the Mamanet website) will take place every 2 years during the CSIT world sport games.
- ✚ Optional: CSIT Mamanet championship for **GROUP B** (women 18 years and over) may take place every 2 years during the CSIT world sport games based on registration and court availability.
- ✚ The Technical committee in its sole discretion will review special requests and reserves the rights to approve or deny them on a case by case basis.

1-2 REGULATIONS

- ✚ Championships follow MAMANET regulations (see: <http://www.mamanet.org.il/International.asp>), technical instructions, regulations and rules of the game.
- ✚ The Organising Committee will set up the time schedule of the competition (starting time and schedule of events) after approval from the Chairman and the Technical Secretary of the Mamanet Technical Committee. This schedule will be strictly respected.
- ✚ In case a cultural program has been prepared and arranged by the Organising Committee around the championships, such program must not interfere with the course of the competitions. Indeed, the CSIT Championships remain the most important aspect of the organisation.



2. PARTICIPATION CONDITIONS

2-1 PARTICIPATING TEAMS

- + More than one team per union can participate.
- + Each participant team shall not have more than 17 members
 - o 14 players
 - o 1 referee
 - o 1 Coach
 - o 1 Team Manager / Head of the official union delegation

2-3 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- + Players are allowed to participate in the CSIT MAMANET Championships as long as they don't play in any professional Volleyball league. (in the first national or international leagues or being paid for playing any professional sport)

3. FAIR PLAY

- + CSIT championships are organized according to the principles of Fair Play. During CSIT Championships, athletes, persons and teams can be granted awards for acts of Fair Play. Fair Play regulations can be found in the CSIT Technical Commissions and Championships General Regulations.
- + Fair play chapter can be found under Mamanet rules of the game (Chapter 7 – Participant Conduct).
- + The participants must behave honourably and with courtesy, in the spirit of "fair play", not only towards the referees, but towards other officials, opponents, team-mates and spectators.
- + Communication between (same) team members during the game is permitted.
- + A team is vicariously liable for every unsportsmanlike act carried out by these bodies: team players; position holders; team fans; any element connected with the team and/or any other element associated with the team.
- + It's prohibited to boo or support in an unsportsmanlike fashion. A referee can stop a game and/or grant points to a rival team if team fans boo or shout in an



offensive way at the referee and/or the rival team. In such a case a ruling of technical loss shall be considered by the technical committee and subject to the committee's decision and authorization.

4. REGISTRATION / FUNDING

4-1 REGISTRATION DELAY

- ✚ Provisional registration: at least four (4) months before the championship starts.
- ✚ Final registration: at least two (2) months before the championship starts.
- ✚ Final registration must include the list of all delegation members (first name - last name – date of birth date - gender – function) Every competitor must provide evidence about her year of birth. (passport etc.)

4-2 COVERING CHARGES

- ✚ Unions pay for all travelling cost to and from the city where the championship is organised (round trip).
- ✚ The organizer Union shall take charge of the following issues:
 - ✓ Transportation of delegations from the airport or train station to the hotel on the day of arrival and departure.
 - ✓ Local transportation during the stay depending on the program (between hotels and sport facilities in particular).
 - ✓ Full board accommodation (e.g. double room, breakfast, 2 meals a day)
- ✚ Every participating Union shall pay a registration fee as determined at the latest CSIT Congress to the organising Union for each member of the delegation.

4-3 ACCREDITATION

- ✚ Each player must possess a valid personal Accreditation card.
- ✚ Accreditation card must include the following information: Name, surname, photo, association.
- ✚ Every player and technical staff member must present an official identity card if requested.



- ✚ Accreditation card and identity cards must be available at the sports hall.

4-4 CANCELLATION POLICY

- ✚ CSIT has a cancellation policy which can be downloaded from the download area of the CSIT website: <http://www.csit.tv/en/news-service/download-area>

5. ORGANISATION / PREPARATION

5-1 ORGANISING COMMITTEE

- ✚ The organising committee of the host is in charge of the preparation and organisation of the championship. The CSIT Technical Commission and a representative of the organising committee are in charge of the management of the championship for all its duration. See Chapter 4 under E of the Technical Commissions and Championships General Regulations.

5-2 INVITATIONS

- ✚ The organising committee sends championship invitations to every CSIT Union (and partners), company sports organizations and guests etc. at least nine (9) months before the start of the championship. Invitations must include the following information:
 - ✓ Participation;
 - ✓ Sporting activities, social and cultural program;
 - ✓ Required Referees;
 - ✓ Boarding facilities;
 - ✓ Arrival and departure accommodations;
 - ✓ If possible, general program.
- ✚ Detailed information can be found in Chapter 4 under D of the Technical Commissions and Championships General Regulations.

5-3 PREPARATION

- ✚ Depending on the situation and with the CSIT Sports Director's authorization, a member of the Technical Commission (chairman or secretary) can visit the location where the championship is organised, at least three (3) months before



it starts, to agree with the organising Union on the planning and preparation of the championship. Travelling expense can be covered under certain conditions by the funds awarded to the Mamanet Technical Commission by the CSIT.

5-4 REPORT

- ✚ Within seven (7) days after the Championships the secretary of the Technical Commission will send the results of the Mamanet Championship to the Sports Director and office of CSIT.
- ✚ No later than one (1) month after the end of the championship, the Technical Commission secretary must send a report about the championships and all the sport results, including the minutes of the TC meetings to the members of the Mamanet Technical Commission, to the Unions, to the Sports Director and to the office of CSIT.

6. REFEREEING

- ✚ When unions don't need to bring in their own referees there will be a standard line: All referees and officials will be arranged by the host
- ✚ Only qualified referees and official scorers shall be admitted to supervise the matches and to ensure that the game rules are ideally applied in a homogeneous way
- ✚ The referees may not fill any other position within their own delegation.
- ✚ The Organising Committee shall provide one Referee and one Scorer for every match. The Organising Committee will also supply a Scorer stand with a Flip Scoreboard, an official Score sheet (with two transferrable copies) and a Referee stand.
- ✚ During the semi-finals and finals, the Organising Committee shall provide one Assistant Referee and four Line-Judges.
- ✚ Referees must be official Referees of their own Union on a national or international level.
- ✚ The Technical Commission will determine the refereeing conditions according to the discipline needs based on MAMANET regulation.

7. APPEAL COMMITTEE

The Appeal Committee is composed of:

- ✚ The CSIT Technical Commission's chairman



- ✚ The CSIT Technical Commission's secretary
- ✚ Optional: A member of the participating Unions. Such person shall not participate in the appeals in which his/her own Union may be involved.
- ✚ An Appeal Committee is appointed for every championship in agreement with **MAMANET** rules of the game and regulations.
- ✚ Appeals for technical reasons must be brought to the attention of the Appeal Committee no later than half an hour after the incident, providing all the necessary information.
- ✚ Detailed information can be found in Chapter 4 under L of the Technical Commissions and Championships General Regulations.

8. AWARDS

- ✚ The first three (3) teams will be awarded a cup and medals: gold for first place, silver for second place, bronze for third place.
- ✚ Detailed information can be found in Chapter 4 under M of the Technical Commissions and Championships General Regulations.
 1. Team ranked 1st: Gold Medal / Champion CSIT MAMANET
 2. Team ranked 2nd: Silver Medal CSIT MAMANET
 3. Team ranked 3rd: Bronze Medal CSIT MAMANET
- ✚ The CSIT logo must appear on one side of the coin and on the other side, the name, date and venue of the championship.
- ✚ The organising union is in charge of providing the awards including expenses.
- ✚ Each team will receive no more than 16 medals (players, Coach, technical manager), plus another medal for the head of delegation.

Each of the other teams will receive 1 souvenir medal per person (16 medals maximum) plus another one for the head of delegation.
- ✚ The CSIT logo must appear on one side of the coin and on the other side - the name, date and venue of the championship.
- ✚ Each Referee will receive a souvenir medal (same characteristics as those described for souvenir medal).



- ✚ The Organising Union can (if it wishes to) **offer** rewards or other commemorative souvenirs of the event, in addition to those mentioned in this chapter.

9. TECHNICAL COMMISSION MEETINGS

- ✚ The Technical Commission chairman or secretary is in charge of convening a meeting of the commission before and at the end of the championship.
- ✚ A summon containing the date and agenda will be sent to all Unions at least three (3) months ahead of schedule.
- ✚ The chairman, secretary, all Unions' representatives and heads of delegation must participate. Referees, coaches of participant Unions and members of the organising committee are all invited (optional participation).
- ✚ A preparation and information meeting is organised before the championships under the responsibility of the chairman (and/or Technical Committee secretary and head of the Organising Committee from the organising Union) to inform all delegations of the planning of the championship, to appoint referees to matches and to clarify regulations if necessary in order to make the event a success.
- ✚ The president or the secretary of the Technical Committee may convene additional meetings during the championship whenever decisions are necessary.
- ✚ The purpose of the meeting after the championships is to evaluate the championship, to proceed with the modifications of the present regulations if necessary, to prepare future events (planning of next championships) and elections, to take into account the reports on the CSIT congress.
- ✚ Once every 4 years (the year of the CSIT electing congress), the chairman and the secretary of the Technical Commission are elected during the last meeting before the congress. The chairman or secretary must send with the convocation to the meeting a call for candidatures for both functions (at least three (3) months before the meeting). The election must follow championship and Technical Committee general regulations.



10. CHAMPIONSHIP ORGANISATION

10-1 GENERAL

- ✚ All championships shall take place given a minimum of four (4) participating teams from different unions.
- ✚ The championship will not last more than four (4) consecutive days, plus another two (2) days for travel (day of arrival, day of departure).
- ✚ Championships are held in pools followed by (depending on the number of teams involved) quarterfinals or direct semi-finals and finals.
- ✚ Each team will play at least three (3) matches during the championship.
- ✚ No team shall play two (2) consecutive matches without an interval of at least 2 hours between them.

10-2 FORMULA

- ✚ The competition will be held in accordance with the formula decided by the T.C.
- ✚ Mamanet T.C keeps the right to change the schedule/Formula of the games even after they were published based on the committee discretion
- ✚ MAMANET rules are applied to all matches.
- ✚ **Rules for championships held in pools:**
 - ✚ The unions involved will be divided into pools according to their ranking reached in the last championship of their class
 - ✚ If necessary, the distribution of the participating teams may be determined by a draw.

Pool ranking criteria

In order to establish the ranking of teams, the following criteria shall be implemented

- ✓ **Number of victories**

The teams will be classified in descending order by the number of matches won.

- ✓ **Ranking Points**

In case of equality in number of matches won, the ranking points will be considered.

Results	Winners	Losers
0-2	2pts	1pts
1-2	2pts	1pts
Technical	2pts	0pts

✓ **Set Ratio**

In the case of equality in the number of matches won by two or several teams, the teams will be classified in descending order by the quotient resulting from dividing the number of all sets won by the number of all sets lost.

✓ **Points Ratio**

If the tie persists as per the set ratio, the teams will be classified in descending order by the result of dividing all points scored by the total of points lost during all sets.

✓ **Still tied ?**

If the tie continues as per the point ratio between two teams, the priority will be given to the team which won the last match between them. When the tie in points' ratio is between three or more teams, a new classification of these teams in terms of points 1, 2 and 3 will be created taking into consideration only the matches in which they were opposed to one another.
